SAT/ACT Comparison


Category	ACT	SAT
Total Time	2 hours and 55 minutes (plus 40 minutes for the Essay [optional]) Time per question - 49 seconds	3 hours (plus 50 minutes for the Essay [optional]) Time per question - 1 minute 10 seconds
Components	215 total questions - Reading, Mathematics, English, Science, Writing (Optional)	154 total questions - Reading, Mathematics, Writing & Language, Essay (Optional)
Scores	Scale ranging from 1-36 Composite score (1-36) & individual scores in each section (1-36), optional Writing (2-12).	Scale ranging from 400-1600 Mathematics (200-800), Reading & Writing (200-800), optional Essay (reported in 3 dimensions each 2-8)

These aspects of both tests are the same...

- Accepted at ALL colleges and universities in the United States
- Essay is optional
- There is NO penalty for guessing






