	Increase your commitment to extracurricular activities and seek out leadership opportunities
Winter (December-February)	
	Review your Honors and Advanced Placement options; plan for courses that challenge
	you and match your interests
Spring (March-June)	
	Meet with your school counselor to discuss next year's class schedule and post-secondary goals
	Register for the <u>PLAN</u> (pre-ACT)
	Take the AP exams if you are enrolled in an AP course (May)
	Plan for ways to get involved in the summer. Many colleges and universities offer summer programming for high school students.
	Consider taking an SAT II (Subject Test); often best to be taken following the completion
	of an Advanced Placement course
Summer (June-August)	
	<u>Visit</u> different college campuses and ask <u>questions!</u>
	Engage in <u>summer</u> extracurricular activities and <u>volunteer</u> opportunities
	Complete summer reading and AP summer work
	Engage in test preparation activities for the ACT and/or SAT for the spring of your junior
	year
