What is the KU Early Career College Academy?

- It is a partnership with 10+ school districts to provide early access to careers in education to their high school students.



How is KU Early College Academy Different from other kinds of Dual Enrollment?

- High school students will come to KU for 1/2 a day.
- They will take two courses each semester, equivalent to a minimum of 12 credits, or one semester of college, prior to graduation.
- Students will be in a cohort to meet other potential college students, developing a sense of connection and community to support their transition to college.

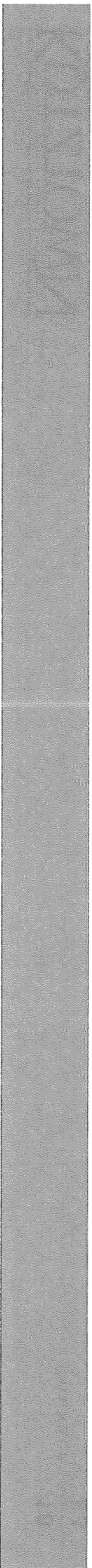
How can I earn extra credits?

Option 1:

How much does it cost?

- Cost is determined by your district as they have different funding models.
- Because of our partnership, we can offer a significantly reduced tuition rate (75% off), which equates to approximately \$99 per credit + fees if tuition remains the same.



What do I need to do to be accepted?

- Talk with your school representative (e.g. guidance counselor).
- Must have a 2.5 GPA

*** PA requires a 3.0 GPA at the conclusion of your program to be certified. Thus, too low of a GPA in the beginning could pose issues for certification later on.



What are my obligations upon completing the year?

- Do I have to go into education? No.
- Do I have to enroll in KU? No.
- What will KU offer me to enroll?
 - Waived admission fee
 - Support for enrolling in classes during the year
 - Exploring other incentives to commit to KU
