

2006 Inductees

Steve Dallas – (Class of 1996) – Steve was a four-year letter winner in basketball and a member of the teams that won the 1993 and 1994 BCIAA Championships and was runner-up in District 3 in 1994.

Steve also won three letters in baseball and was named All-Division in 1995 and All-Berks in 1996 at second base. He also played for the Carpenter Cup for two years.

Steve continued to play baseball at Shippensburg University where he was a four-year starter at second base and earned All-PSAC Honors.

Jeff Gible – (Class of 1994) – Jeff was a three-time PIAA District 3 Wrestling Champion for the Bulldogs, setting a record for the most District 3 wins by a wrestler in the AAA classification. His overall record was 121-14.

He was named winner of the Bud Lynholm Award three times as the best wrestler in Berks County.

Kristy Kowal – (Class of 1996) – Kristy was named Pennsylvania's Female of the Swimmer of the Year in both 1994 and 1995 having won 16 PIAA District 3 Gold Medals and fifteen PIAA State Gold Medals.

She was a five-time PIAA Champion in the 200 IM, 100 breaststroke and 400 free relay.

She remained a Bulldog at the university level, swimming for the University of Georgia. There, she was a member of a World Record setting 400 medley relay team and World Champion in the 100 breast and 400 medley relay in 1998.

Kristy was also an NCAA Top 8 Recipient and the NCAA Woman of the Year in 2000. In all, she would break eight American records during her swimming career.

Kristy's greatest highlight came in the Games of the XXVII Olympiad in Sydney, Australia where she earned a Silver Medal in the 200m Breaststroke.

Megan Lewis – (Class of 1995) – Megan was a four-year letter winner in both tennis and swimming for the Bulldogs. Her tennis teams won four Berks championships. She and her partner won one District 3 Doubles Championship.

Megan qualified for States twice and was named All-Berks, finishing undefeated in her singles matches.

As a swimmer, Megan won 11 District medals and one PIAA Gold Medal (in a relay event) and set Wilson records in the 50 and 100 freestyle events. She also set a record for career points scored (628).

Her teams compiled a 47-2 dual meet record that included four CPL Championships, four District Championships, a state runner-up and a PIAA Team Championship as well.

On the collegiate level, Megan swam for Gettysburg College, setting numerous school, pool and Centennial Conference records. She was named an NCAA Division III All-American.

Ed Sep – (Class of 1992) – Ed was Wilson's first All-American soccer player, earning that honor in 1992 and he captained the Bulldogs to the PIAA State Championship.

Ed began with All-Division honors in 1989 and was All-Berks in 1990. He was a four-year starter on the team and was selected as the Outstanding Player in Berks County his senior season, earning All-State and All-American recognition as well.
