

Wilson School District Academic Achievements

September 2017

The Wilson School District had 190 students recognized with an AP Scholar Award. The AP Program recognizes high school students who have demonstrated outstanding college-level achievement through their performance on AP Exams.

October 2017

November 2017

The PA Department of Education provided the Wilson School District with its School Performance Profiles, which are a rating system for schools across the commonwealth. The data took a look at the 2016-2017 school year to score schools on a 100-point scale. Wilson School District was home to the number 2 and number 3 schools in the county with Wilson High School at number 2 with a score of 88.8 and Green Valley with a score of 87.1.

January 2018

Shiloh Hills Elementary School was named a National Blue Ribbon School -Exemplary High Performing Schools for 2017. Shiloh Hills is one of 342 schools in the nation and one of 18 schools from Pennsylvania to be recognized in 2017. With over 130,000

schools in the nation, this honor indicates that Shiloh Hills is in the top 1-2% of schools in our country!

February 2018

The Wilson School District was ranked at #50 in Pennsylvania on the Niche 2018 Best School Districts in America list. Our ranking is based on a rigorous analysis of key statistics and reviews from students and parents using data from the US Department of Education. Ranking factors include state test scores, college readiness, graduation rates, SAT/ACT scores, teacher quality, public school district rating and more.

May 2018

Kyle Wetherhold, principal at Wilson West Middle School, was named Principal of the Year for the state of Pennsylvania.

June 2018

Wilson High School earned a silver medal and a ranking of #34 in the recent US News and World Report list of Best High Schools in PA. Schools are ranked based on their performance on state-required tests and how well they prepare students for college.
