

## PROFILES FOR 2017 WILSON ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

**RYAN EBNER:** Class of 2008. Ryan was a three-year starter for Wilson in both baseball and basketball. During his senior year, the Wilson Basketball team won the Berks County Championship, and made it to the PIAA quarterfinals. That team tied the school record for wins with 29. Ryan was named the Berks County Basketball Player of the Year that season. Ryan was also a starter on three Berks County Baseball Championship Teams for the Bulldogs in 2005, 2006, and 2007. In 2007, Ryan was a team captain, as well as member of the All-County team. After he graduated from Wilson, Ryan went to the Hill School for a post graduate year. He was a starter on the Hill School's first ever Mid Atlantic Prep League (MAPL) championship team in basketball. Ryan also played baseball, and was second team All-MAPL. Ryan then went on to Bucknell University, where he lettered in both baseball and basketball his freshmen year. He was a four-year letterman in baseball. In 2010 and 2011, Ryan was named to the Patriot League's All-Tournament team. Ryan was also the winning pitcher in the 2010 Patriot League championship game. In 2011, Ryan was the Patriot League Pitcher of the Year, with a 6-1 record and an ERA of 3.53. Ryan graduated in 2012 with a degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering.

**CASEY MOORE:** Class of 2000. Casey was a team captain for both soccer and swimming. The soccer program won the District III Championship in 1998. Casey was selected as a 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-County midfielder twice and a 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Division midfielder three times during his career. The swim program won every dual meet and 4 District III Championships during his career. Casey earned 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-American honors during his junior and senior seasons. He was also selected 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-County for two years and 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Division for three years. He earned 5 Pennsylvania State medals and 10 District III medals.

**MICHAEL RUTT:** Class of 2008. Michael was a four-sport athlete during his time at Wilson. He lettered in Soccer, Cross Country, and Indoor/Outdoor Track and Field. He went on to become a four-time All-American while running track at the University of Connecticut. In his professional running career, Michael represented the USA multiple times and placed 6<sup>th</sup> at the 2012 World Indoor Track and Field Championships in the 800 meters. He competed at two Olympic Trials (2012, 2016) and was the 398<sup>th</sup> American to ever break the four-minute mile barrier.

**JESSICA SMILKO:** Class of 1994. Jessica was a three-sport athlete at Wilson. She played soccer, basketball, and ran cross country, lettering 9 times. She was a 3-time member of the All-County Team for soccer. Her soccer teams won four consecutive Berks titles, two PIAA District 3 Titles, and played for the PIAA State title. She scored 98 goals and recorded 42 assists during her Wilson career. Jessica was also a two-time participant in the BCIAA Cross Country Conference Run and the PIAA District III run. She served as a captain of the basketball team her senior year and the soccer team for both her junior and senior years. In addition, Jessica received the John P. Spadafora Student Athlete Award, awarded to an athlete that lettered in two sports, ranked in the top third of the graduating class, and demonstrated sportsmanship, courage and leadership, for the Class of 1994. After Wilson, Jessica continued her soccer career at Rutgers University, where she scored 6 goals and recorded 2 assists in her career.

**JOSH SMITH:** Class of 2007. Josh was a three sport athlete at Wilson and played a major role in helping accumulate six Berks County championships, including 3 his senior year, across baseball, basketball, and football. He was named Berks County Baseball Player of the Year in 2006, along with posting a career record of 19-2 as a pitcher. In football, he broke the career receiving touchdown record and was selected to participate in the prestigious Big 33 Classic. As a basketball player, he finished his career with 1,280 points and helped lead his team to a Berks County championship his senior year. At the conclusion of his high school career, Josh was named the Wilson High School Male Athlete of the Year. Josh spent 3 years at the University of Pittsburgh on a baseball scholarship and then transferred to play football at Kutztown University. At Kutztown, he played wide receiver and helped lead the Golden Bears to their first PSAC championship in school history.
