

Adam Bainbridge – Class of 2013

Adam was a four-year starting forward for the Wilson soccer team from 2009-2012. He was an All-State performer in 2011 and All-American in 2012, the latter earning him the Most Outstanding Athletic Achievement award; an internal WHS award presented by Tim Fick. He also was named the All-Berks Fall Player of the Year in 2012.

Additionally, Adam was a four-year starting pitcher for the Bulldogs from 2010-2013. Most notably, he was an All-County performer in 2011. Overall, he posted a 13-4 combined pitching record.

At Old Dominion University (ODU), Adam was a three-year starting pitcher, finishing his career with a 3.45 ERA over 229.2 innings. During his time at ODU, he earned First Team All-Conference USA honors during his senior season, including a streak of 31.1 innings pitched without an earned run, setting a school record. He finished with 3 complete games, including a CG shutout.

Finally, Adam was drafted in the 30th Round of the 2017 MLB Draft by the Kansas City Royals.

Sarah Deck – Class of 2012

Sarah's tenure at Wilson was defined by an exceptional three-sport prowess. She garnered prestigious distinctions such as Berks County Field Hockey Coaches' Association Division I All-State and All-County First Team honors, making an indelible mark on the field hockey team. As captain, she played a pivotal role in leading both the softball and field hockey teams to the Berks County Division I championship. Her prowess extended beyond the confines of the field, with achievements spanning indoor winter track, where her dedication earned her varsity letters in the 400M and 800M events. Sarah's commitment to excellence was evident not only in athletics but also in academics, as showcased by her induction into the National Honor Society and accolades such as the E. Jerry Brooks Academic Excellence Award. Continuing her journey at Temple University, Sarah's legacy continued to flourish. A four-time letter winner and captain of the field hockey team, her achievements included Big East Conference All-Tournament and All-Conference 1st Team awards. Furthermore, her athletic accomplishments were complemented by academic excellence, reflected in her membership in the National Field Hockey Coaches Association Academic Squad and her place on various conference All-Academic Teams.

Rodney Hill – Class of 2009

Rodney Hill was a 3-year letter winner for the Bulldogs, playing both defensive and offensive line. After leaving Wilson, Rodney went on to receive a full scholarship to Howard University, where he was a 4-year letter winner on the defensive line. Rodney's passion for football took him to the coaching circuit where he has made stops at Kutztown University, Penn State University, Mercer University, Howard University, the New York Giants, University of Central Florida, the Detroit Lions, the Buffalo Bills, LSU, Duke, and the University of Arkansas. Rodney has gained experience as a Head Strength and Conditioning Coach, Director of Performance Nutrition, and Director of Sports Science. He received his master's in educational leadership from Mercer University and is married to the former Kimberly Mazzapica.

Caitlyn Karr – Class of 2011

Caitlyn graduated from Wilson in 2011. During her athletic career, she received the honor of Berks County Swimmer of the Year. She was a 4 year letter winner and 13 time All-American. Caitlyn's 200 Freestyle time was the fastest in Wilson's history when she set the record in 2010. Her achievements helped lead the team to both District and State Championships. During this time, she was also a District Champion in both the 100 and 200 freestyle in 2010. Her leadership and success throughout the years led her to be team captain her senior year. Caitlyn's accomplishments at Wilson helped her continue her athletic career at Penn State University. During her time there she qualified for the 2012 Olympic Trials and NCAA Championships all 4 years. Her hard earned titles such as Team Captain and All-American led her to win The Jerome Weinstein Award at Penn State. Caitlyn's hard work in and out of the pool has helped mold her into the young professional she is today.

Patrick Zerbe – Class of 2009

Pat was a team captain of the 2008 Wilson Football Team, which dominated their way through an undefeated regular season, followed by a District 3 Championship and State Semi-Finals Appearance. A recipient of the John Gurski Award, Pat prides himself on his deep Wilson roots, following his father (Mike Zerbe) and uncles through the historic Wilson Program. He was named the Channel 69 Big School Player of the Year, All Lancaster-Lebanon League Offensive Lineman and Linebacker, Lancaster-Lebanon Lineman of the Year, All Berks Football Offense and Defense, All State Linebacker and recipient of the Bill Brumbach Sportsmanship Award in 2008. Through his tenure at Wilson High School, Pat lettered in Football, Lacrosse, and Wrestling. Following a successful High School career, Pat went to Penn State University for Football as a Preferred Walk-On, where he earned a full scholarship, was a two-year letterman, and was named Team Captain of the 2013 team.
